To whom it may concern,


I am writing this letter on behalf of myself. On August 1, 2019 at roughly 8:40 pm while traveling on 148 passing through Cedar Lake I was pulled over by Officer Craig. On this particular night I was traveling home from work, after working a 12-hour shift. I work as a registered nurse at Hartford hospital in the Emergency department. I was traveling through Cedar lake and to be truthfully honest after an exhausting 12-hour day of working in one of the busiest emergency rooms in the state my mind is in a fog. So I unfortunately did not realize how fast I was driving through that area as I was just focused on getting home safely without falling asleep.

As a usual habit for me I always tend to slow down to about 15-20 mph before I reach the cross walk in front of the cedar lake snack shack, even when I am doing the speed limit. This is because there are always people walking in that cross walk and it is not very well lit. The only reason the officer pulled me over was due to me slowing down and breaking in front of the cross walk. I truly do not believe the officer was doing radar. This is because when the officer first approached my vehicle and I asked him why I was pulled over all he stated was "speeding." When I asked the officer how fast I was going he was unable to tell me how fast I was going. It was not until he returned with my actual ticket that he had written on it that I was going 45/30 mph.

I am disputing this ticket at this time. I do not think it is fair that I should have to pay a speeding ticket one the Officer was unable to tell me what my actual speed was. I also do not think it's fair that I get punished for slowing down in front of a cross walk and protecting the innocent people.

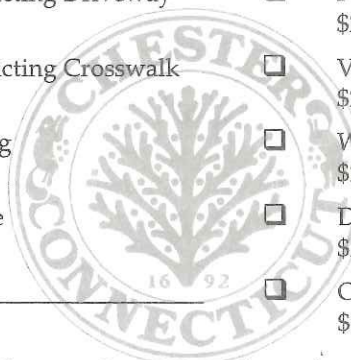
